Identification To Vote Is Now Required

Identification must be presented at all election sites in order to vote.

Any of the following are considered acceptable forms of identification:

The following types of identification are acceptable and must have a Colorado address:

- A valid Colorado Driver's License
- A valid Colorado ID card issued by the Colorado Department of Revenue
- A valid US Passport
- A valid employee ID card with a photo of the eligible elector issued by any branch, department, agency, or entity of the United States government or of Colorado, or by any county, municipality, board, authority or other political subdivision of Colorado
- A valid pilot's license issued by the Federal Aviation Administration or other authorized agency of the United States
- A valid US military ID card with a photo. (This is the only form of identification that may have an out of state address.)
- A copy of a current utility bill or bank statement, with a Colorado address.
- A government check, government paycheck or other government document that shows the name and address of the elector. This includes but is not limited to, a Certificate of Degree of Indian or Alaskan Native Blood or a certificate issued by and institution of higher learning.
- A valid Medicare or Medicaid card
- A certified copy of a US birth certificate for the elector issued in the United States (will have a raised seal)
- A certified documentation of naturalization
- A valid student identification card with a photograph of the eligible elector issued by an institute of higher education in Colorado
