ACTIVE CITIZENSHIP: SERVING AS AN ELECTION JUDGE

Election Judges are the people who assist voters at the polling place on Election Day. Election Judges are a critical part of the democratic process, ensuring the rights of voters. In order to serve as an election judge you must:

- Be a United States Citizen;
- Be a registered voter in Arapahoe County;
- Be mentally and physically able to perform the assigned tasks;
- Be free of any conviction for fraud or election offenses;
- Not be related to any candidate on the ballot; and
- Attend a paid, mandatory training class.

WHAT DOES AN ELECTION JUDGE DO?

Election judges are assigned by the Clerk and Recorder to confirm voters' eligibility, provide assistance with forms, activate voting machines, and generally assist voters. Each polling place has a lead (supply) judge and several support judges.

Lead (Supply) Judges:

- Visit the polling place before Election Day and arrange for entry at 6:00 a.m. on Election Day.
- Pick up the supplies the day before the election.
- Arrive at the polling place by 6:00 a.m. on Election Day.
- Perform all duties assigned by the Clerk and Recorder.
- Return machine cartridges and supplies on Election night.

Support Judges:

- Arrive at the polling place by 6:00 a.m. on Election Day.
- Perform all duties assigned by the Clerk and Recorder.
- Stay at the polling place and assist with closing procedures until completed.

HOW DO I BECOME AN ELECTION JUDGE

There are two ways to become an election judge:

Submit an Election Judge Application

Complete the Election Judge Application in this brochure and submit it to the County Clerk's office. All applications are reviewed and, upon approval, a certification and notice of training letter is sent to the applicant.

OR

Caucus Process

Submit your name to the precinct leader who submits the list of names to the Party Chair and then to the County Clerk's office. All applicants from the Caucus are sent a certification and notification of training.

BENEFITS

- Judges are paid \$200 for working on Election Day. Lead judges are paid extra.
- Serve your community and state.
