A MESSAGE FROM THE COUNTY CLERK

As you know, individuals with disabilities are close to my heart, and it's important to me that you are able to exercise your rights and fully participate in everything life has to offer. In an effort to ensure that voters in Will County who are elderly or who have disabilities have an opportunity to vote, we offer a variety of voting aids and options to help make your voting experience more pleasant, comfortable, and private.

I want you to feel welcome and make sure you are aware of your choices when you come to your Polling Place on Election Day.



Voting Aids available at the Polling Place for elderly and handicapped voters:

- ★ Voting booths designed to accommodate a wheelchair
- ★ Hand-held magnifier – to enlarge ballot
- ★ Pens with sponge rollers – to make it easier to hold the pen when darkening the ovals

Voters with Disabilities have several options to vote:

- ★ Vote absentee by mail – available for those unable to vote in person on Election Day
- ★ Vote with the assistance of a friend, relative or two Election Judges (one from each political party)
- ★ Curbside Voting – available to voters who are physically unable to enter the Polling Place
- ★ Vote with the AutoMARK Voter Assist Terminal

Assistance in marking the Optical Scan ballot:

Voters who can receive assistance are:

- ★ Voters who cannot speak, read or write the English language
- ★ Voters who are unable to mark their ballot because of a permanent or temporary disability
- ★ Assisted Voters complete the All-Purpose Voter's Affidavit; persons who assist voters must complete Supporting Affidavit on the back side of the All-Purpose Voter's Affidavit.
